#### **PRO WATERCROSS TOUR**

# SPORTS TOURISM OUR OUTREACH

Through our Sports Tourism Grant Program, Pensacola Sports supported 31 events representing 17 different sports including baseball, basketball, bowling, equestrian competitions, disc golf, fishing, softball, soccer, swimming, volleyball. These grants are funded by the Escambia County Tourist Development Council (TDC) and are administered by Pensacola Sports for events that demonstrate significant potential to draw visitors to the area.






